Proposal: Conversion of the current managers office and staff locker room/store room into a female washroom and associated works.

Remit:

The Theatres Trust is the national advisory public body for theatres. We were established through the Theatres Trust Act 1976 'to promote the better protection of theatres' and provide statutory planning advice on theatre buildings and theatre use in England through The Town and Country Planning (Development Management Procedure) (England) Order 2015, requiring the Trust to be consulted by local authorities on planning applications which include 'development involving any land on which there is a theatre'.

Comment:

Thank you for consulting the Theatres Trust on the above application. The Trust is supportive of the works proposed.

We were engaged by the applicant to provide comment and guidance while plans for this and other theatres were in development. We articulated our support for their efforts to expand and improve WC provision which will serve to enhance the audience experience by reducing queues and congestion through adding capacity.

Currently there are no female toilets within the basement level of the Duke of York's Theatre and there is a need for additional female toilets more generally, which is similarly true across a number of historic theatres. The proposed works will not impact upon the historic or architectural significance of the theatre, and will provide three cubicles one of which is for ambulant users.
