Proposal: Display of an internally illuminated projecting sign measuring 4m x 1m; & Display of an internally illuminated projecting sign measuring 4m x 1m. Linked to 20/06760/ADV.

Remit:

The Theatres Trust is the national advisory public body for theatres. We were established through the Theatres Trust Act 1976 'to promote the better protection of theatres' and provide statutory planning advice on theatre buildings and theatre use in England through The Town and Country Planning (Development Management Procedure) (England) Order 2015, requiring the Trust to be consulted by local authorities on planning applications which include 'development involving any land on which there is a theatre'.

Comment:

These applications for advertisement consent and listed building consent have come to the attention of the Trust because they relate to development at the Sondheim Theatre, specifically the addition of a vertical internally illuminated sign to its Wardour Street elevation.

The Sondheim has recently undergone a refurbishment programme as well as some temporary Covid-19 adaptions to enable reopening, and the Trust has commented on a number of recent applications. This signage is to be located towards the rear of the theatre and will assist with wayfinding and increasing the theatre's prominence and visibility when approaching from the north along Wardour Street. Drawings show that it will be promoting the Les Miserables show which has been hosted at the theatre since 2004.

Signage can be considered to form an integral element of theatre character and as noted within the application documents there is similar signage in an equivalent position to the Gielgud Theatre along Rupert Street. Therefore we do not consider the proposal would give rise to any concerns with regards to impact on the building's character and significance. We also do not
