Proposal: Refurbishment of the Balcony Bar

Remit:

Theatres Trust is the national advisory public body for theatres. We were established through the Theatres Trust Act 1976 'to promote the better protection of theatres' and provide statutory planning advice on theatre buildings and theatre use in England through The Town and Country Planning (Development Management Procedure) (England) Order 2015, requiring the Trust to be consulted by local authorities on planning applications which include 'development involving any land on which there is a theatre'.

Comment:

Thank you for consulting Theatres Trust on this application for listed building consent at the Harold Pinter Theatre which is a Grade II listed heritage asset. This proposal seeks to carry out refurbishment and alteration to its Balcony bar. We have been consulted on this scheme by the applicant at pre-application stage, and submitted written comments to them in support.

This bar does not function efficiently, being constrained by its small size and layout. It was originally an office and was later converted. The existing bar counter is not of significance as it is am more modern insertion, although this room contains two decorative historic radiators. These plans will see a new counter position along the rear wall with a complete refurbishment of this room. The radiators will be relocated to alternative positions within this space.

We are supportive of these works. Repositioning the bar will improve circulation and reduce congestion into and out of the bar area. With this being in effect a separate room it will be better conducive to also providing a private area/function space which will increase the theatre's flexibility and make it more attractive as a venue for producers and hirers. In turn this will

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enhance its financial sustainability. Existing panelling will be retained and the indicative decorative scheme is sensitive to the theatre's significance as a heritage asset.

Therefore we are supportive of the granting of listed building consent.
