Protecting theatres for everyone



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How will we fund theatres for the future – and how much will it cost?

These are the questions that will be debated in the final session of the **Theatres Trust's Conference 18 Adapt & Thrive** on **16 October** at the **Lyric Hammersmith**.

Conference attendees will be the first to see the key findings of the capital works sector survey that the **Theatres Trust** has carried out in partnership with **UK Theatre**, providing insight on the scale, type and value of work needed and identifying trends in building type and geography.

Arts Council England Director of Strategic Partnerships, Paul Bristow, will be trailing the findings of the Cultural Cities Enquiry into future models for investment in culture as well as discussing the Arts Council's draft 10 Year Strategy 2020-2030.

Social entrepreneur, Lord Andrew Mawson will offer his unique perspective on the balance of responsibility between the state, community and private sectors for investing in and shaping our communities.

The session will close with a panel discussion on the future capital needs of the theatre sector and what new models of investment we need to develop. The panel will include Paul Bristow, Judith Kilvington from subsidised theatre Citizens Theatre, Glasgow and Julian Russell, CEO of commercial theatre operator HQ Theatres & Hospitality, and they will be joined by a developer and local authority representative (names to be confirmed).

Jon Morgan, Director of Theatres Trust said:

"Theatres are about more than beautiful buildings or a good night out – they make our towns and cities great places to live and they are one of the few remaining places that communities can come together. That's why it is vital that we continue to invest in theatre infrastructure so theatres can meet the changing needs of artists and communities.

But times are tough and theatres are having to look beyond the traditional models of funding. Conference 18 will provide a space for everyone with an interest in theatre buildings to explore new ideas and ways we can create a sustainable future."
