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Comment:

Thank you for consulting Theatres Trust on this application for planning permission at Westacre Theatre, which seeks the addition of a wooden outbuilding for storage.

Westacre Theatre is an important rural community theatre which hosts local amateur productions as well as some touring productions, cinema, classes and other events. It is an important facility for local people providing opportunities for participation in the arts. Paragraph 98 of the NPPF (2024) seeks planning decisions to plan positively for facilities such as this.

We commented on a previous application in 2019, which sought installation of storage sheds due to the theatre having lost off-site provision. Having adequate storage is commonly a challenge amongst small theatres so the desire to increase provision is understood.

The proposed shed will be a simple timber structure located within the theatre's car park on an area of hardstanding. The visual impact of this installation is limited, with vegetation along the site boundary also shielding it from view. It will provide the theatre with the storage space it needs.

We therefore support the granting of planning permission.
