This proposal relates to the two 'Opera House' fascia signs located either side of the main entrance along the Quay Street elevation. Currently this consists of white lettering against a black background. The replacement will be white lettering of a different font against a gold background. This will be reflective of the palette of decorative details along that façade. It forms part of a wider package of recent external repairs and refurbishments at the theatre.

The principle of signage of this nature is long established in this position. The existing signage is not original, therefore there will be a neutral impact on significance.
