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Comment:

Thank you for consulting Theatres Trust on this application for listed building consent at the Assembly Halls Theatre.

This application is related to a previous application and works which were undertaken around 2022; we also commented on those plans. There was need for improved means of egress. This will now be completed, necessitating alterations within the theatre's kitchen servery area. Alongside this will be additional work to improve the kitchen's function and working conditions including new ventilation to meet current standards, wall and floor finishes and a suspended ceiling. Additional louvres will be installed and a doorway to the store will be enlarged for better access.

This is a less sensitive part of the building, much of which is equipped with more modern fittings as demonstrated by images contained within the Heritage Statement. These proposals are necessary to secure and support the safe and efficient operation of the theatre.

As such, we support the granting of listed building consent.
